OUR PERFORMANCE

Patient revenue increased by 14.2% in 2021, while drug and supplies costs increased by 20.0% due to increased volumes. At the end of 2021, Bigfork Valley had \$13,987,919 invested in capital assets, net of accumulated depreciation, and \$10,355,000 in outstanding debt.
